C. ToR for the consultant:

Background of the project:

Deafblindness is a relatively new issue in the field of disability in Nepal. There are very few organizations working in this field. The Deafblind movement in Nepal is very new and in its infancy. To increase the profile of deafblindness in Nepal and create a synergic effort, the National Federation of the Deaf Nepal (NDFN), Nepal Association of the Blind (NAB), Society of Deafblind parents (SDBP), and Deafblind Association Nepal (DAN) have been working together in a consortium to implement 3 years project (1st of April 2019- 31st March 2022 with a 6 month No Cost extension until 30th September 2022) funded by Jersey Overseas Aid Commission (JOA) through Sense International(SI). This project is entitled **Healthy Life for People with Deafblindness in Nepal**. The project has been implemented in four district (Rupandehi, Kaski, Morang and Kathmandu) with each partner taking the leadership in each district.

The intended overall outcome of the Healthy Life for People with Deafblindness in Nepal project is better health outcomes for Persons with Deafblindness (PwDB), through Better health outcomes for PwDB with improved identification of deafblindness, access to basic health care, families and professionals equipped with the skills to ensure PwDB build self-care skills and reduced stigma/social exclusion.

- Output 1: Better informed decision-makers ensuring that deafblindness is included in government health policy, specifically an improved definition of deafblindness is promoted for effective identification and social welfare for PwDB.
- Output 2: Improved access to health assessments and rehabilitation for PwDB
- Output 3: Reduced stigma towards PwDB through public health awareness campaigns and trainings
- Output 4: Strengthened CSOs, DPOs and NRC ensuring that the health rights of PwDB are recognised and realised to take work forward

The project aims to show the Government of Nepal what needs to change and how to effectively include PwDB. Through building the capacity of Organizations of People with Disabilities (OPD) partners, they will become a driving force for promoting the rights of PwDB in Nepal and will hold government decision-makers to account. They will advocate for improvements to the definition of deafblindness to ensure PwDB are counted and can access health and other benefits.

Job description:

Data Collection:

NDFN will provide:
